e Berlin Wall 1961-1989

Historical Significance:

The Berlin Wall was constructed in 1961 to separate the democratic country of West (the politically communist Eastern Bloc. T protected by a number of obeservation to by a powerful military presence. Over the of the wall, 50, 000 attempts were made to in over 600 deaths. In 1989, a series of rad changes occurred in the Eastern Bloc. Afte of civil unrest, the East German governme 9 November 1989 that all GDR citizens co Germany and West Berlin. Crowds of East crossed and climbed onto the wall, joined on the other side in a celebratory atmosph next few weeks, a euphoric public and sor chipped away parts of the wall; the goverindustrial equipment to remove most of tl physical Wall itself was primarily destroy fall of the Berlin Wall paved the way for C reunification, which was formally concluc 1990.

On April 20, 1999 two senior students, Er Dylan Klebold, murdered a total of 12 stu teacher in their high school in Columbine injured 24 additional students, with three being injured while attempting to escape pair then committed suicide.
